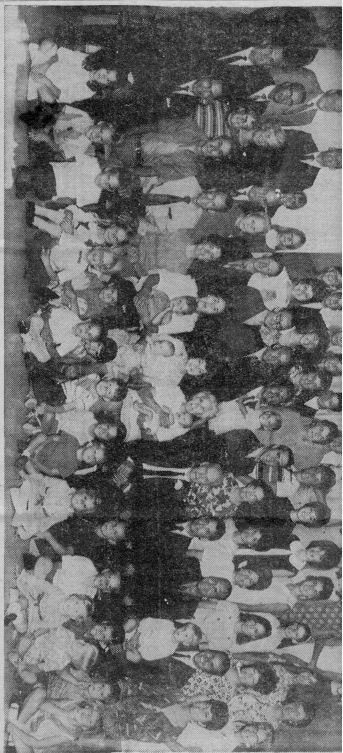

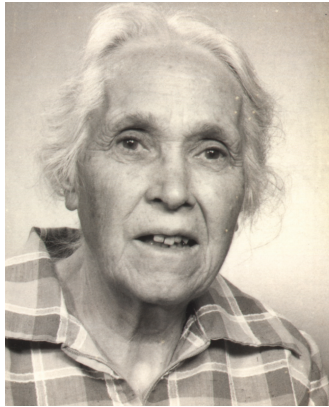

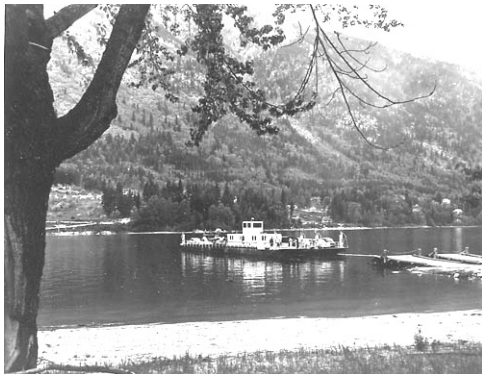

He attended Sacramento State College and earned a general secondary teaching credential. Milo is musically talented with the steel guitar and string bass. He belonged to the musician's

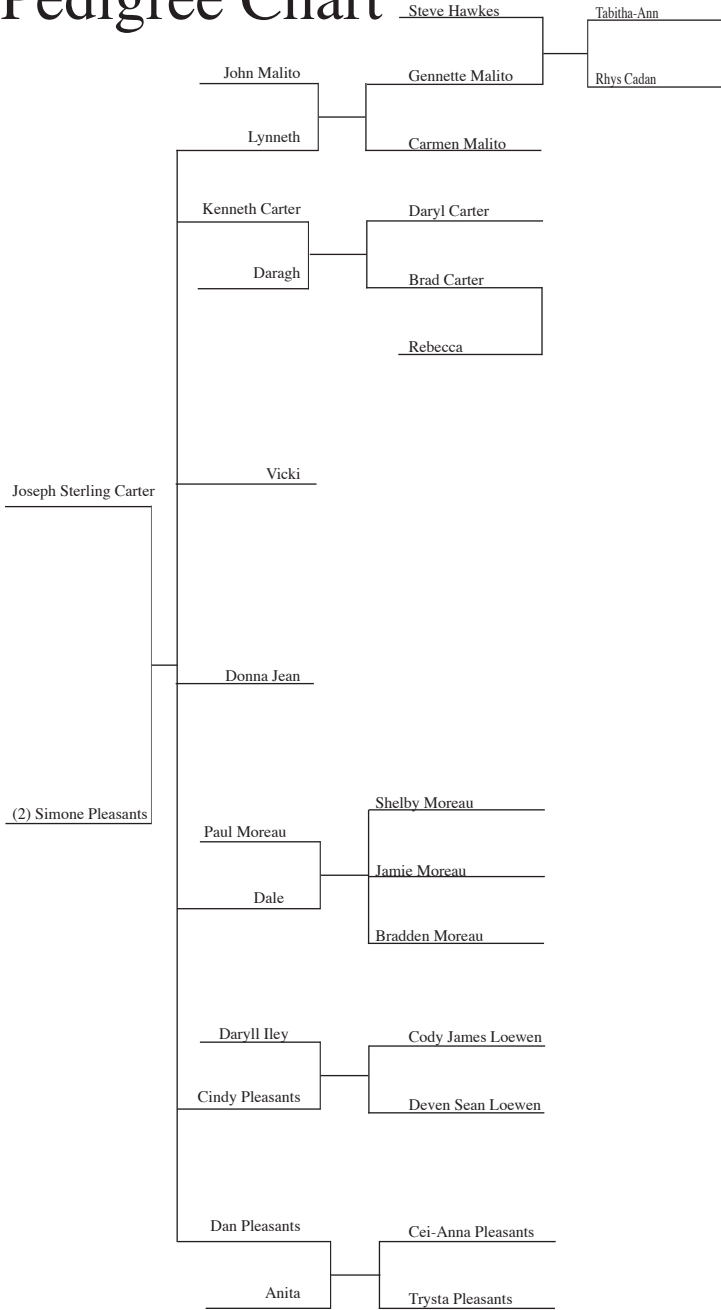

Joseph Stirling Carter was born on December 23, 1923 in Sterling, Alberta, Canada. He is the second child of Viva Jones and Lamonde Carter. His first marriage was to Joyce Palmer. They were married on May 28, 1949 at Nelson, British Columbia, Canada. They had five children: Lynne, Kenneth Darrel, DonnaJean, Vicki Marlene, and Dale Louise Carter. Joyce died in 1980. Joseph married Simone Herbert (Pleasants) on April 4, 1986 in Nelson, British Columbia, Canada where they reside. She had two children: Cindy Pleasants (Iley) and Daniel Pleasants. Joseph was a fireman and paramedic, and is retired now. Nelson is located about 140 miles north of Spokane, Washington in the Kootenay Mountain range. It is very hilly and mountainous, with Kootenay Lake nearby which empties into the Columbia River.

Joe was in the Canadian Army along with his older brother, Milo. He served from 1942 to 1945 in WWII and was sent to England where he was in on the invasion of France. They crossed the English Channel and used infantry landing equipment to get ashore. Joe received a shot from a bullet fragment that entered the left side of his jaw, and lodged in his right cheek bone where it has remained. It has not bothered him so he never required an operation.

Joe belongs to the Royal Canadian Legion which is similar to the United States Veterans of Foreign Wars.

He enjoys playing pool at their Lodge. They have entertainment nights, dances, and suppers. Simone is on their board of directors which is for both men and women. She is also on the board for the Jubilee Manor, a senior citizens long-term convalescent and retirement home, and she volunteers her time there. Most of the people are ambulatory and can come and go as they want.

Simone and Joe have been raising poodles. They have a male and female, but their female poodle was attacked by a 250 pound black bear that came into their back yard to get fruit. During the long hot seasons, the bears can't get enough berries or water in the Kootenay Mountain range where Nelson is nestled, so they come to the family residences to find their food. Joe chased the bear away from his poodle, but it turned suddenly and pursued him. Joe escaped into his house through his glass patio door. The bear stood high on his hind legs and repeatedly hit at the glass, until it finally turned and sauntered off. The poodle did not die but was badly injured, and it has been unable to produce anymore offspring since then.

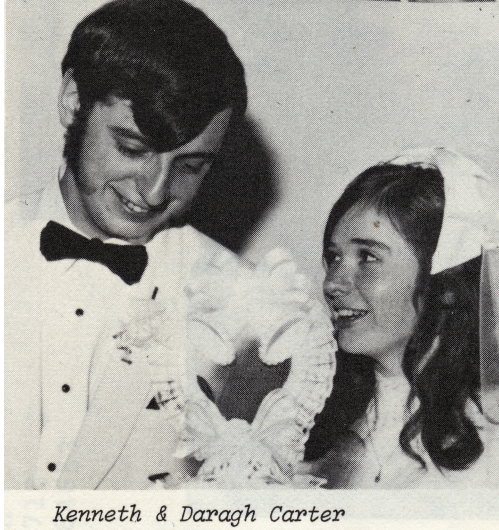

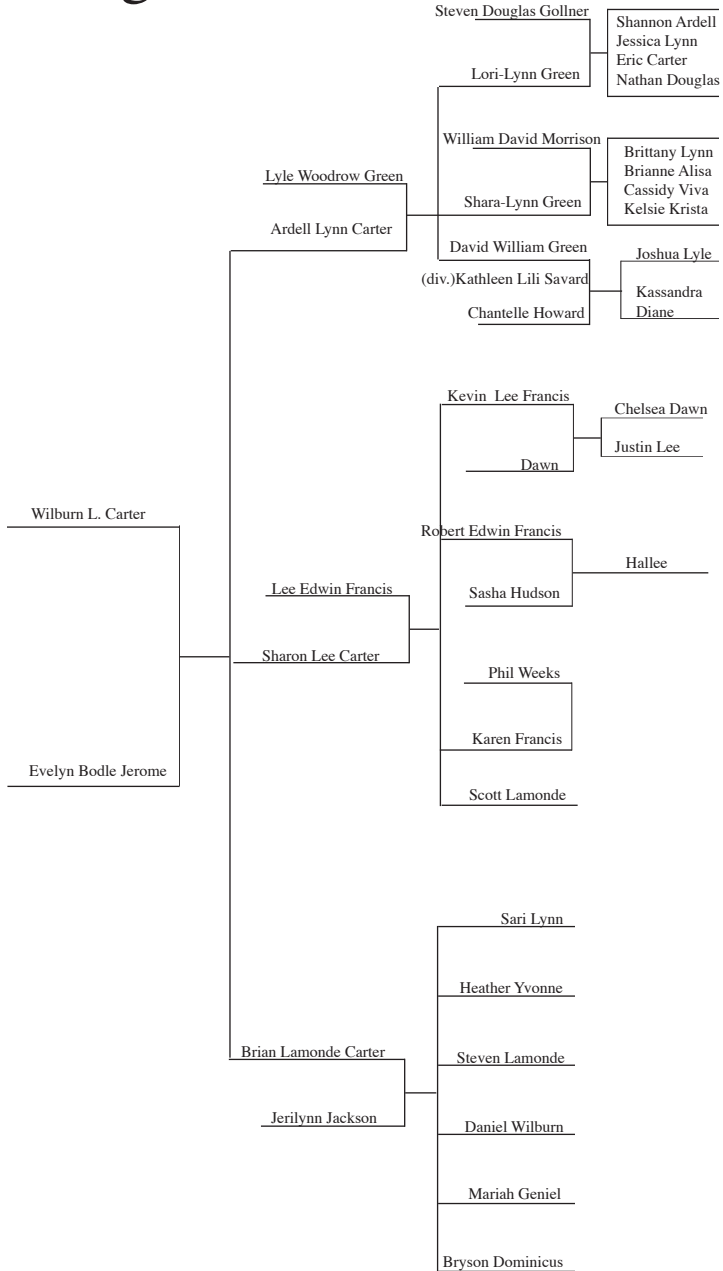

Evelyn Bodle Jerome Carter Memories

Wilburn Lamonde Carter was born September 26, 1925 in Raymond, Alberta, the third child of Lamonde Lial and Viva Jones Carter. He was sometimes called “Phatt” but more commonly known as Bill. He drove Greyhound bus, worked in logging camps and for Great Northern Railway, drove furniture moving trucks long distance, freight trucks and heavy duty equipment for the Sanitation Department of the Regional District of the Kootenays. He was an avid Prospector. Every spare minute he traveled the mountains of British Columbia, staking claims to mineral properties (some of which he sold). His children remember Sunday drives where he kept one eye on the road and the other on the surrounding terrain where he often stopped to break a few interesting looking rocks while they picked huckleberries or wild flowers or were chased by curious goats. It was while he was making a road into one of his claims that his Cat hit an outcropping of shale and slid over the edge and he was thrown to his death at age 54.

He served in many Church callings including Councilor in Branch and Stake Presidencies, Stake High Councilman and just about every other office that is required in a Branch in the Mission field. Probably his favorite calling

was Sacrament Chorister. He was forever a Missionary, even in the days when he lived away from organized Branches and was less active. He inherited his mother's gift for memorizing and entertained many times with his recitals from Robert Service and Robert Swift. We used to joke about his reason for marrying me was that I had Robert Service's book.

Evelyn Bodle Jerome was born in Trail, British Columbia, the first of four children of Thelma Gustina Johnson and Herbert Bodle Jerome. Her younger brother, Carl, was killed when he was eight years old. Her sister, Dot and her brother Bob and their families still live in British Columbia. In 1939 Evelyn's father died, and five years later her mother married an old family friend, Frank Monaghan, and a new sister Fran was born.

After graduating from Trail Business College, Evelyn worked for a law firm in Trail, then moved to Nelson where she was also a legal secretary. After her children were in school she worked for Inland Gas for 17 years.

Memories:

Bill and I met at a party that my girlfriend and Bill's brother, Joe, were attending. Joe had agreed to go to the party if his brothers Phatt (Bill) and Scrapey (Johnny) could go. My fiance and I were invited. He told me later

that when Joe warned him that flirting so outrageously with me was annoying my fiancée, he said, “Too bad, that’s the girl I am going to marry.” Whether or not he was serious about that or just out to make a conquest remained a question for some time. Memories:

I never remember thinking the town I grew up in was terribly small, until I went away to college. Ricks College was huge to me, there were about 10,000 students. That was the size of the entire town of Nelson, where I came from. Imagine my surprise when we traveled to Provo for my first BYU football game. When I walked into that stadium and saw 20,000 people (twice as many people as Nelson), all in the stadium, all LDS and most of them cheering for BYU, I was in awe, well part of it was I had never been to a football game before, and what was all this pushing and shoving and jumping on top of each other, and if it was football, why were they always throwing and catching the ball? Well back to the small town. We had a small branch of the Church, and by the time I graduated from High School, we even had a building of our own to meet in (a very old, renovated house). For several years we met in the Eagles Hall, then in the 1964 the church bought some property at the top of Vancouver Street and converted the old home there to our first small chapel. It worked wonderfully, as far as we were concerned. When I graduated from Primary I was immediately put in as the Pianist and Sunbeam teacher. I also played the piano for Sacrament Meeting.

I attended Young Women's, however I had to recruit a couple of friends to come with me, so I wasn't the only girl in my class.

We spent many a summer's week with Aunt Dot and Uncle Jack, both in Kaslo, and then at the trailer park at Mirror Lake. I also remember many a "shopping trip" to Spokane. We sometimes went to buy school clothes, and often would go Christmas shopping in Spokane. After Ardell was married I would like to spend some of my summer with her and her family. Once Mom and I flew to Vancouver for some meetings to do with her work. It was fun to stay in a hotel, that was a treat, as it didn't happen too often.

I enjoyed high school, the social life was great, and even my grades didn't suffer from all the fun times I had. I was active in Student Government, being Minister of Fi-

nance my last year of high school. Also my Senior Year I organized the very first beauty pageant that was put on in our school. 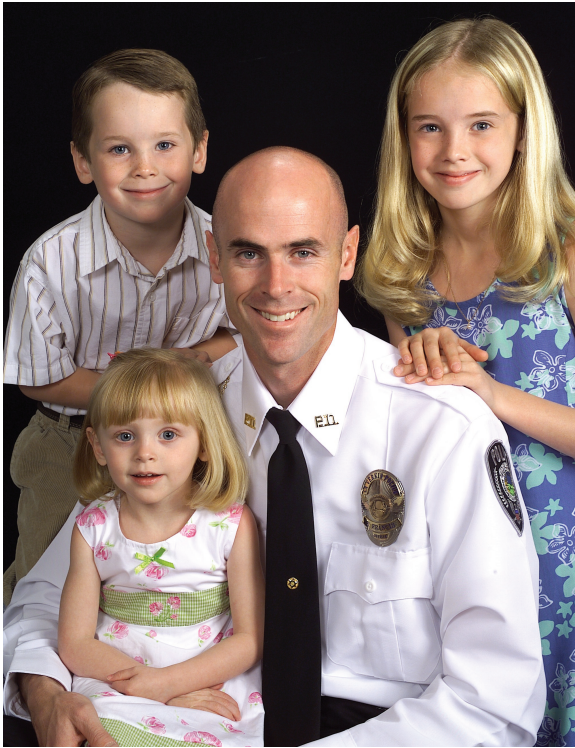

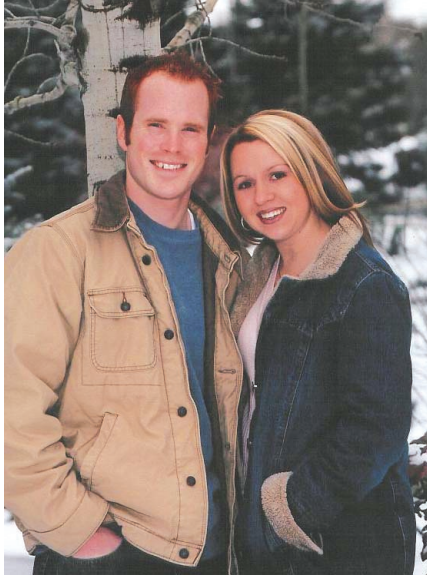

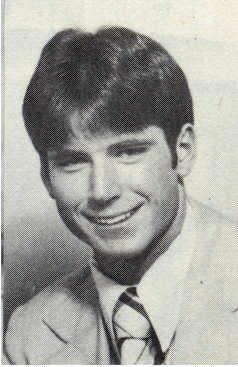
